CAN YOU DESCRIBE YOUR INTERNSHIP AT REAL IMPACT ANALYTICS AND WHAT WAS YOUR MISSION THERE?

From the start to the end, my internship was a real adventure. My role was post-delivery customer success management for Telcos across Africa using analytics.

WHAT MADE YOU APPLY FOR THIS KIND OF INTERNSHIP?

I realized that I was not prepared yet for the professional world and that it was a unique opportunity for me to gather insights and experience.

WHAT DIFFERENCES DID YOU NOTICE BETWEEN THEORY AND REALITY?

I believe that theory is a good base and a must-have. However, the sad truth is that we are far from ready to enter to the labor market.

DID YOU RECEIVE A GOOD THEORETICAL BACKGROUND AT THE SBS-EM?

I had the incredible chance to go twice on an exchange programme: one in Australia, and the other one in Japan. I felt a difference between Solvay's students and the local students I met in these countries.

WHAT DID YOU CONSIDER AS YOUR STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES?

My friends often describe me as someone who is well-organized, determined and extrovert. On the other hands, I do have some weaknesses. I am a perfectionist, super demanding, and I am sometimes too informal with people.

WHAT WAS A BAD DAY FOR YOU DURING YOUR CIP?

The first two weeks of my internship were quite challenging. I had to learn so many things in a short amount of time that I felt overwhelmed.

WHAT WAS A GOOD DAY FOR YOU DURING YOUR CIP?

I always liked the moments where my internship coordinator gave me feedbacks. During these valuable moments, I had the opportunity to

understand what were my strengths as well as the aspects I should work on to improve myself.

DID YOU HAVE THE FEELING OF HAVING AN IMPACT DURING YOUR CIP?

When looking for a job, I pay attention to three things: work content, work atmosphere, and the impact I have through my work.

I am glad to say that during my internship at Real Impact Analytics, I did have an impact. For instance, I launched new initiatives and conducted trainings when I was on site in Cameroon.

WHAT WAS YOUR BEST MEMORY DURING YOUR CIP?

One of my best memories was when I was in Cameroon and got the chance to experience what it is like to work in Africa.

WHAT IS YOUR CAREER REFLECTION?

For the moment, I am looking for a full-time position in management consulting or in technology. In other words, I am looking for a job where I will be challenged within a company with an international exposure. Finally, I am looking for a job where the work atmosphere suits me well.

DO YOU HAVE A LAST ADVICE FOR STUDENTS WHO WANT TO PURSUE A CIP?

Through my academic path, I had the chance to meet people studying abroad. It's not a euphemism when we say that Solvay needs to improve regarding internships. This credited internship was one of the most insightful and interesting experience I ever had. **Do not ask yourself to many questions, just do it.**
